From the Principal

Kaya to the ENPS community,

Welcome to Term 3. We have a very busy term ahead of us with several sporting events, incursions, excursions and of course, our Book Week Dress Up Parade.

Recess and Oval

All students Years 1-6 now have access to the oval at recess and lunch time. Many thanks to the senior students who have been marking out the oval into dedicated playing areas and helping the junior students with their ball skills.

The duty roster has been reviewed so that there are always two staff members on duty on the oval.

Communication between staff using walkie talkies is maintained across the duty areas so that all students are being carefully monitored by duty staff members.

School Arrival and Departure

To manage student safety and duty of care, we will be implementing a structured procedure for all classes in Pre Primary – Year 6. This process will commence on Monday 3 August, Week 3.

Kindergarten students will continue with their established processes for drop off and pick up.

Kiss & Drop: Parents can utilise the designated 'Kiss-and-Drop Zones' located along **Homer Street** and within the **Staff Carpark**. Traffic signage must be strictly followed.

KAYA WANJOO – hello and welcome.

Upon arrival at school, all students are encouraged to attend Breakfast Club, have some breakfast and a chat and then get ready for the school day.

BOORDAWAN – see you later.

At the end of the school day, all students from Pre Primary-Year 6 will be taken by a staff member to the Undercover Area (UCA) and be seated with their bag ready to be dismissed by the staff member.

Students will then be released to parents/carers/siblings or to walk home/go to the car.

Bus students will remain in the UCA with the bus duty staff member to wait for their allocated bus.

Kindergarten students must sit on the classroom mat at the end of the day. Staff will only dismiss a child once they physically sight the parent outside the classroom door.

Good Standing

As part of the Student Behaviour in Public Schools policy, all schools are required to implement a good standing policy. This semester ENPS has re-introduced Good Standing as part of the ENPS Behaviour Policy.

All students are granted Good Standing at the beginning of the term. If they continue to demonstrate the expectations and values of ENPS, they will remain in Good Standing and participate in non-curriculum based/social activities as a reward.

A student loses good standing following a breach, or series of breaches, that are classified as major behaviours.

The Principal or Deputy will contact parents/carers to advise them of their student's loss of good standing.

We are currently trialling the new approach and have a Good Standing activity planned for Friday 31 July. The event is based on the International Day of Friendship.

We are looking forward to as many students as possible participating and celebrating their positive behaviour at school.

Students who do not achieve Good Standing will be supervised in Room 9 and provided with an alternative lesson.

PEAC Testing

In Western Australia, the PEAC test is a Year 4 cognitive ability assessment used to select students for the Primary Extension and Challenge gifted program.

The Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC) program is a part time, enrichment program for academically gifted Year 5 and 6 students in WA public schools.

It offers specialist courses, multi age groups, and opportunities for advanced thinking, real world problem solving, and self paced learning.

All Year 4 public school students in WA sit the PEAC test each year.

Testing will be on Monday 3 August 2026 during normal school hours. If students are absent there is a small window for us to make sure they get the test completed.
