From the Dentist

Dental Health Week is 7—13 August.

This year's theme set by the Australian Dental Association is "Mind, Body, Mouth. Its all connected". It serves as a timely reminder that while looking after our teeth and gums is essential for good oral health, it is also essential to ensure the health of the rest of the body.

Bacteria in the mouth can travel to different sites of the body. Poor oral health is associated with conditions such as: Diabetes, gut issues, Alzheimer's Disease, Lung Conditions, Inflammatory Bowel Disease and so many more.

It should not be normal to expect that you will need to have some teeth filled or removed because of tooth decay or gum disease. After all, you do not expect to lose an arm or leg, so why expect to lose any of your teeth? Australians should aim to keep their teeth for their lifetime. There are multiple ways to get information about oral health during Dental Health Week. If you have not had a recent visit to the dentist, it is a great time to make an appointment. If you are looking for information, click through the teeth.org.au website to find trustworthy and up-to-date oral health advice written by dentists from around Australia.

Four steps for good oral health:

1. Brush your teeth twice a day using a fluoride toothpaste.
2. Floss everyday.
3. Eat a healthy, balanced diet and limit added sugar intake.
4. Visit the dentist regularly.

If your child has concern or a toothache, please remember that all children who attend school (aged 5 to 16) are eligible for free dental care through the school dental service. Check ups through the program run on a waitlist system only. However, the school dental service is always available for emergency care during school hours.
