Attendance

Regular attendance and engagement in school is important for the development of intellectual and social emotional skills and contributes significantly to educational outcomes. Through primary school, children are expected to acquire the foundational skills that will prepare them for future progress through the education system. While engagement with school and learning is multifaceted, absence is a marker of disengagement and helps predict school completion and future engagement in work or further study. A higher rate of absence is also directly related to a lower level of academic achievement.

At East Narrogin Primary School we are working hard to continuously improve the development of the whole child through a sense of belonging derived through:

- the school environment.
- positive and supportive teacher relationships.
- · peer relationships.
- personal characteristics, such as conscientiousness, optimism and self-esteem.

Our families play an important role in supporting us with attendance. We ask for your support to:

- Promote a positive attitude towards attendance and reinforce the school's belief that 'every day matters'.
- Notify the school of a planned absence if it falls during the school term.
- Notify the school of an absence as soon as possible.
- Provide an explanation of a student's absence within two school days from the start of the absence.
- Work cooperatively and collaboratively with the school to develop and implement improvement strategies when your child's attendance has been inconsistent.
- Contact the principal to discuss and seek authorisation for vacations during school terms.
