Attendance – Every Day Matter!

I have been so thrilled with the increased number of families contacting the school when their child is unwell or at appointments. This information allows the school to record your child's absence as 'authorised' rather than 'unexplained'.

Education sets students up for life. Research also shows that lower rates of school attendance and disengagement from school can be linked to unemployment, lower income, riskier health behaviour and contact with justice authorities. Not completing school can restrict a student's future opportunities, including their ability to fully participate in social, civic and economic life.

We know there are many reasons students face challenges coming to school. Whilst some absences are unavoidable, such as specialist medical appointments out of Narrogin, many of these factors can be worked through and supported by the school or a community agencies and local services. East Narrogin Primary School are here to help.

As the Principal of our school I am committed to creating a thriving learning environment for our students to love, be engaged in and excel in their learning.

Students with moderate or severe attendance are in the process of co-designing individual engagement and attendance plans; families will be notified if their child sits within these categories.
