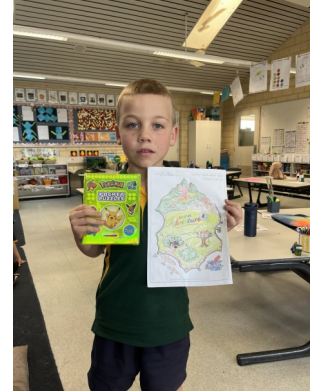
We sold \$1812.33 worth of books!
